Many dogs are very spoiled


Many have lots of love, food and toys

Even though in the past, he was considered royalty




He is gentle

Their dog racing career is usually over at 3 ½ years of age




Their food is not good at all

You are a kid, but you can help




- Tell all your friends and family about the truth of greyhound racing
